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## 2021 SUHBA Safety Award Application Instructions:

Please fill out the attached information to apply for the 2021 SUHBA Safety Award. Any fatalities experienced by the company wishing to apply for the Safety Award will render that company ineligible.

Please attach a copy of your SUHBA Safe Contractor checklist. If you have not submitted it to the SUHBA office, you may submit it by attaching the completed form.

### How to obtain an NCCI (National Council on Compensation Insurance) rating.

- If you have one, you can probably obtain it from your insurance company if you have insurance.
- If you do not have an experience rating for your company, it could be due to:
  1. No workers' compensation insurance. If you are the owner and have no workers, you will not have workers' compensation insurance. If you have employees, the state requires workers' compensation insurance for your employees any day they work.
  2. Your insurance is not reporting to the NCCI because your premium value is not enough. This is based on your payroll and possibly the hours worked by your employees for the previous year.
  3. Also, this rating is based on four (4) years of data so if you have not been in business for four (4) years, you will not have a rating.
- **The best way to find out if you have a rating is to call the NCCI. Phone: 1-800-622-4123. They can tell you if you are eligible for a rating and they recommend calling them rather than calling your insurance company. If they say you do not have a rating, you automatically have a 1.00 experience rating. That is an average rating so please put 1.00 for your experience rating.**

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- REPORTING:** All accidents and injuries must be immediately reported to the Project Manager.
- INDEMNITY FOR SAFETY VIOLATIONS:** Subcontractor shall conform to the Occupational Safety Health Act of 1970, the Contraction Safety Act of 1969 and all standards and regulations which have been or shall be promulgated by the parties or agencies which administer said Acts, as well as all applicable state or local occupational health and safety ordinances. Subcontractor shall directly receive and respond to, defend and be responsible for any citation, order, claim, charge, or criminal or civil actions, arising by reason of the failure of Subcontractor or its agents, employees, supplies, and subcontractors to so comply, regardless of whether such non-compliance results from active or passive acts or matters against which Subcontractor is obligated hereunder to indemnify & hold harmless the Owner, Project Manager, & General Contractor from & against any liability, loss, damage, costs, claims, awards, judgments, fines, expenses, including litigation expenses, reasonable attorney’s fees, claims or liability for harm to persons or property. (if applicable)
- LADDERS:** The extension ladder must extend 3' above the entry point of the trench, floor, or roof and tied off. Workers are never to use a stepladder as a single ladder that is leaning against a wall while in the closed position. Workers are never to stand on the top step of a stepladder, or where the midline of their body extends past side of the ladder. Any ladder that is damaged must be tagged "Out of Service" and be removed from the job site. Job-built ladders are not permitted.
- POWER TOOLS & CORDS:** Cut or frayed extension cords must never be used and must be tagged "Out of Service" and be removed from the job site. Damaged tools must be tagged "Out of Service" and be removed from the jobsite.
- FIRE PREVENTION:** "Smoking" is not permitted in homes under construction at any time. Gasoline and other flammable liquids are not permitted in any house.

- FRAMERS:** 42" Safety railings with toe boards will be installed at any openings and/or elevated platform greater than 6' in fall height/depth. (if applicable)
- ROOFERS:** An approved personal fall arrest system including a safety harness is required when working on a roof greater than 6' from the ground. (if applicable)
- STUCCO:** 42" Safety railings with toe boards will be installed and tied off to the house for scaffolding greater than 6' in height. (if applicable)
- DRYWALL:** Metal scaffolding shall be used for high ceilings and stairways instead of job-built scaffolding. (if applicable)
- PAINTERS:** Respirator is to be worn when spraying. (if applicable)
- COMPETENT SUPERVISION:** Each Subcontractor is required to have a competent person that always speaks English on site. A competent person is one that can identify safety hazards and has the authority to stop work until known hazards have been eliminated before proceeding.
